

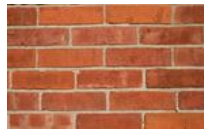


### Subject Specific Vocabulary

<b>Wood</b>	A material that is strong and used for many purposes, such as, fences, benches and sheds.
<b>Paper</b>	A material that is soft and light that is mainly used for writing and toilet paper.
<b>Cardboard</b>	A material that is similar to paper but is stronger and is mainly used for boxes and cartons.
<b>Brick</b>	A material that is a small rectangular block usually used for building houses and walls.
<b>Plastic</b>	A material that is very lightweight and can be used for lots of purposes, such as, bottles, boxes, trays and many containers.
<b>Wool</b>	A material that is soft and often used for clothing, rugs, cloths and carpets.
<b>Straw</b>	A material that is a tough piece of grass and can be used for making baskets, bedding and food for horses.
<b>Fabric</b>	A material that is soft, washable and comfortable and is mainly used for making clothes.
<b>Glass</b>	A material that is solid and transparent and is mainly used for cups and windows.
