

Pupil Premium Funding – 2018/19

English Martyrs' Catholic Primary Academy is committed to narrowing gaps and ensuring that every pupil excels. The pupil premium is additional funding given to publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers.

English Martyrs' currently has 39 Pupil Premium Pupils, 13.7% (2017 National Average for FSM* is 28.5%)

In the 2018 to 2019 financial year, schools will receive the following funding for each child registered as eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years: £1,320 for primary-aged pupils.

Schools will also receive £2,300 for each looked-after pupil who: has been looked after for 1 day or more, was adopted from care on or after 30 December 2005, or left care under (A special guardianship order or a residence order).

The Academy will receive £55400 of pupil premium funding during the academic year of 2018/19. The following actions and expenditure are planned for the academic year 2018/19.

Live Projects and development plans for 2018-19

Here, at English Martyrs', we are constantly striving to deliver the best support for our pupils. Motivated in our goal of closing the attainment gap for disadvantage pupils, we are continuously looking for new or additional interventions that can help us meet our goal. Below are the plan expenditures for 2018-19, designed to help close the gaps, raise attainment and support our disadvantaged pupils.

Issues

Monitoring has demonstrated the need for a focus on the basic skills of oracy, reading and in particular, writing. The development of these skills will enable pupils to make further progress in the core subjects as well as with the foundation subjects; applying skills widely. National and in-school research also shows the positive impact of interventions which are collaborative, promote metacognitive skills and facilitate feedback; the school offers such interventions tailored to each individual pupil's needs. Each child benefits from an individually tailored Pupil Premium Provision Map. The school continues to support the emotional and social well-being of our pupils in receipt of pupil premium.

Tailored small group Basic Skill sessions for pupils from Reception to Year 6 in mathematics and English.	£10403	Funding for teachers and teaching assistants to work with groups of children in the core subjects of English and Maths to ensure tailored provision.
Daily one-to-one reading to support fluency and comprehension.	£10310	Funding for teachers and teaching assistants to work with individuals in the core subject of reading to ensure tailored provision.
Bespoke interventions: research backed collaborative, metacognitive and feedback interventions tailored to individual and small group needs.	£20592	Funding for teachers and teaching assistants to work on topic driven intervention projects to address specific skills. Includes funding for trips, workshops and experiences to inspire and enthuse the learners.
Booster sessions for year 6 and 2 pupils in mathematics and English	£450	Funding for teachers to deliver tailored additional support in preparation for SATs
Physical maths and physical literacy sessions.	£800	Delivered by specialist coaches to support writing and maths alongside Personal Learning and Thinking Skills.
Additional library resources	£2000	Children's newspapers, journals, specifically selected fiction and non-fiction resources to ensure tailored reading choices.

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Activity	Expenditure	Rationale
Chaplaincy provision	£6300	To allow pupils the opportunity to build self-belief and self-esteem through worship and collaboration with peers.
ELSA support and training	£1000	Emotional Literacy Support Assistant to work with individuals or small groups supporting emotional wellbeing. This costing includes supervision from an Educational Psychologist.
Rainbows bereavement and loss sessions	£500	Funding for ELSA and Tas to deliver program which fosters emotional healing among children grieving a loss from a life-altering crisis.
Tailored additional training for teachers and teaching assistants	£350	Training specifically tailored to the known, anticipated and arising needs of the pupils such as: emotional literacy, team building and precision teaching.
Subsidised school trips	£1300	Funding to ensure all children have full access to the range of wider opportunities offered.
Educational Welfare officer	£995	Funding to support families with attendance or lateness issues to ensure pupils have full access to the curriculum.
Contingency Plan	£400	For any further interventions or support that may be required over the academic year

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
