

## Pupil Premium 2017/18

The Academy received £46050.36 of pupil premium funding during the academic year of 2017/18. The table below shows how the money was spent.

### Issues

Monitoring has demonstrated the need for a focus on the basic skills of oracy, reading and in particular writing. The development of these skills will enable pupils to make further progress in the core subjects as well as with the foundation subjects; applying skills widely.

The school continues to support the emotional and social well-being of our pupils in receipt of pupil premium. The following actions and expenditure are planned for the academic year 2017/18:

Activity	Expenditure	Rationale
Individual and small group sessions in English and mathematics for pupils in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6	20,550	Funding for teachers, teaching assistant, Deputy Head release time to work with groups of children.
Individual and small group sessions in phonics and mathematics basic skills for pupils in Years 1 and 2	12,000	Funding for teachers, teaching assistant and HLTA to work with groups of children.
Maths booster sessions for Year 6 pupils	£450	Delivered by class teachers in an after school session for 5 months. Children secure and practice maths skills in preparation for SATs
Gross motor skill sessions preparing pupils for writing in years Reception and Year 1	£400	Delivered by specialist coach, developing children's early writing habits. Improving mobility and coordination and improving team working skills
Physical maths sessions for pupils in years 1, 2 and 3	£400	Engaging pupils in maths. Developing their maths subject knowledge along with improving their physical well-being
Chaplaincy Provision	£6300	To allow pupils the opportunity to build self-esteem and self-belief through worship and collaboration with peers. Develop team work opportunities and promote the need to present to lead teams of pupils and adults.
ELSA Support and Training	£1000	Emotional Literacy Support Assistant. To work with individual children or small groups supporting emotional well-being. This costing to include supervision from an educational psychologist
Rainbows bereavement and loss sessions x 2	£500	Teaching assistants to deliver including resources
Intervention projects including school trip/visit	£1300	Ensuring that all pupils have full access to the range of extra-curricular activities that are available.
Education Welfare Officer	£1700	Support families who have poor attendance or late issues to ensure that pupils have full access to the curriculum.
Music lessons	£300	Individual or small group sessions delivered by a specialist teacher of music from local secondary school
Training for Teaching Assistants	£350	Training specifically focused on the current needs of the pupils such as emotional well-being, literacy skills, sensory diet, precision teaching

Resources for specific interventions	£500	Specialist resources to promote engagement
Magazines and newspapers	£300	Ensure pupils have a range of texts that are available to them for discussion.
